Advice to candidates:

Spend five minutes **planning** your answers before writing. If you are unhappy with any part of your answer, cross it out and continue.

You should try to write at least two pages.

Read the poem by Maya Angelou below. Write about the poem and try to comment on:

- The themes and ideas raised in the poem
- The poet's use of images
- The mood of the poem
- The structure of the poem

'Caged Bird'

In a profound show of resilience
The free bird leaps
on the back of the wind
and floats downstream
till the current ends
and dips his wings
in the orange sun rays
and dares to claim the sky.

But a bird that stalks down his narrow cage can seldom see through his bars of rage his wings are clipped and his feet are tied so he opens his throat to sing.

The caged bird sings with fearful trill of the things unknown but longed for still and his tune is heard on the distant hill for the caged bird sings of freedom.

The free bird thinks of another breeze and the trade winds soft through the sighing trees and the fat worms waiting on a dawn-bright lawn and he names the sky his own.

But a caged bird stands on the grave of dreams his shadow shouts on a nightmare scream his wings are clipped and his feet are tied so he opens his throat to sing. The caged bird sings with a fearful trill of things unknown but longed for still and his tune is heard on the distant hill for the caged bird sings of freedom.

dips = to go down to a lower level stalks = to walk in an angry or proud way clipped = The purpose of clipping a bird's wings is not to prevent flight completely but to ensure the bird is unable to achieve or sustain upward flight and to prevent escape trill = a series of quickly repeated high notes sung by a bird
